Its Recruitment and Outreach Time Again!

As we transition into summer, and for those entering recruitment season, here are a few suggestions and tactics that teams might want to include in their summer outreach endeavors.

Engage People in Their Own Communities

o Host outreach activities in community centers and underserved neighborhoods where transportation may be a barrier. Recruiting in diverse locations demonstrates that you value everyone's participation on your team.

Communicate with Families

 Connect with parents and families to highlight the benefits of FIRST, especially when recruiting younger students. Reach out to families who may feel their children don't fit into a FIRST team or who belong to underrepresented communities.

Provide Information in Multiple Languages

 Translate team information and outreach materials into the languages spoken by the ethnic groups in your community who might attend your events.

Showcase Diversity in Publicity and Outreach

Ensure your publicity and outreach activities represent all groups within your community.

Discuss Both Technical and Non-Technical Roles with Everyone

Be mindful of how you discuss roles during outreach events, ensuring you talk to all potential members about both programming/building and presentations/teamwork, regardless of gender.

Actively Recruit Students with Disabilities

 Plan outreach activities that are accessible to students with disabilities. Be ready to discuss options that will help all students succeed in team meetings. Consult with specialists to identify necessary adaptations for students with disabilities to contribute effectively to your team.

Allow for Questions

o The best way to learn more is to allow participants to ask questions. This not only allows for open communication and clarification, but may also help the team problem-solve in the future.

June Holidays and Events:

June is *Pride Month* — Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer Pride Month was established to recognize the impact that gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender individuals have had on the world. LGBTQ+ groups celebrate this time with Pride parades, picnics, parties, memorials for those lost to hate crimes and HIV/AIDS, and other group gatherings.

June is also *Immigrant Heritage Month*. It was established in June 2014 and gives people across the United States an opportunity to explore their heritages and celebrate the shared diversity that forms the unique story of the United States. The month celebrates immigrants across the United States and their contributions to their local communities and economy.

June 2: Native American Citizenship Day commemorates the day in 1924 when the US Congress passed legislation recognizing the citizenship of Native Americans.

June 7: Feast of the Most Sacred Heart is a solemnity in the liturgical calendar of the Roman Catholic Church.

June 10: The martyrdom of Guru Arjan Dev is observed by members of the Sikh faith. Guru Arjan Dev was the fifth Sikh guru and the first Sikh martyr.

June 11 (sundown) to June 13 (nightfall): Jewish Holiday Shavuot marks the giving of the Torah on Mt. Sinai. The Ten Commandments are read in synagogues, just as they were in the desert on Mt. Sinai over 3,300 years ago.

June 14: Flag Day in the United States is observed to celebrate the history and symbolism of the US flag.

June 15 (sundown) to June 16 (sundown): Waqf al Arafa is a holy day for all Muslims that is observed on day nine of the last month in the Islamic calendar.

June 16 to June 20: Eid al-Adha honors the willingness of Ibrahim to sacrifice his son Ismail as an act of obedience to Allah. As with Eid al-Fitr, it is distinguished by the performance of communal prayer (or ṣalāt) at daybreak on its first day.

June 19: Juneteenth, also known as Freedom Day or Emancipation Day, was established as a federal holiday in 2022. This celebration honors the day in 1865 when slaves in Texas and Louisiana finally heard they were free, two months after the end of the Civil War.

June 21: National Indigenous Peoples Day, or First Nations Day, gives recognition to the indigenous populations affected by colonization in Canada.

June 29: Feast Day of Saints Peter and Paul is a liturgical feast in honor of the martyrdom in Rome for the apostles St. Peter and St. Paul in Eastern Orthodox Christianity.

June 30: The last Sunday in June is Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ+) Pride Day in the United States. It commemorates the Stonewall Riots that occurred on June 28th, 1969.

FIRST is not only about robots; it's about learning. On my FIRST Robotics Competition team, The Thunder Chickens, I learned how to code from our mentors. It was really cool to see my code controlling an actual robot. I got really interested in computer science. For most of my time on the team, I was the only female programmer.

FIRST gave me the skills and confidence to help change lives in my community. As a result, I was inspired to create a tech camp to help close the gender gap in engineering and introduce more girls to computer science. I named the camp 'Hello World' because I wanted girls to say hello to computer science. The phrase, which is the first thing many programmers type out in a new computer science language, is symbolic of all the possibilities with computer science. I hope to show girls that their ability is unlimited.
